






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Year 5 Curriculum - Summer 2

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Theme:

Our theme this half term is **Unsolved Mysteries** and we will be exploring this concept throughout the curriculum. For our entry point, we will be learning about the famous pilot and explorer Amelia Earhart, the first female pilot to fly across the Atlantic Ocean. However, despite being a successful pilot Amelia went out on an expedition in 1937 and never returned. Using evidence, we will be answering the question and trying to solve: What really happened to Amelia Earhart?



English:

In our English lessons we will be focusing on suspense stories, and looking at the book *High Rise Mystery* by *Sharna Jackson*. We will be also watching the short film *Alma*, and using this as inspiration to write our very own suspense stories.

In our whole class reading lessons, we are continuing to look at the children's book *The Violet Veil Mysteries – A case of Grave Danger by Sophie Cleverly*.

These texts all link with our theme of unsolved mysteries.
